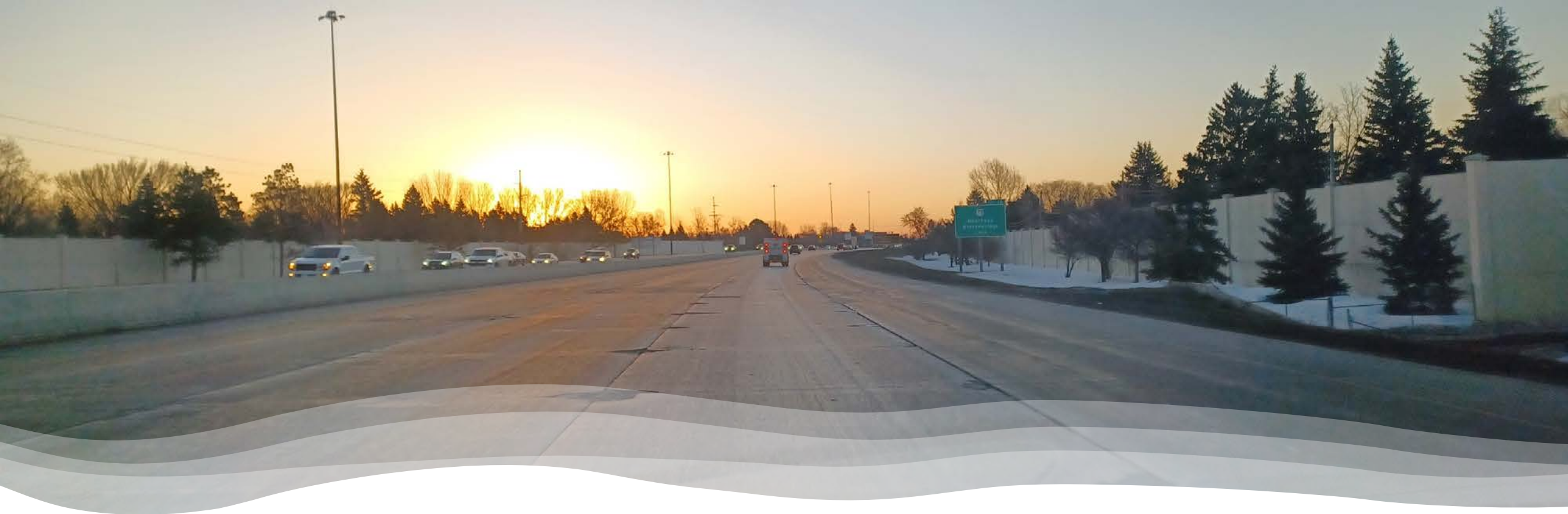

Moses' "Obituary"

Born in Egypt to godly parents in the time when Pharaoh had ordered the Jewish babies to be killed.
"Cast into the Nile"



It was said of Moses that he was beautiful, and his mother hid him for three months. His mother preserved his life by waterproofing a basket and carefully cast him in the reeds of the Nile. Pharaoh's daughter named her found child Moses. "Because I drew him out of water."



When Moses grew up, he refused to be called the son of Pharaoh's daughter choosing rather to endure the ill-treatment with the people of God than to enjoy the passing pleasures of sin." Hebrews 11:25 to be continued later in the presentation.

2 Peter 3:8 "beloved, that
with the Lord one day is
like a thousand years, and
a thousand years as one
day."

Psalms 90:5-6

Thou carriest them away as with a flood; they are as a sleep: In the morning they are like grass which groweth up. In the morning it flourisheth, and groweth up; In the evening it is cut down, and withereth.



Isaiah 40:6 1 Peter 1:24 "All flesh is like grass, And its glory like the flower of grass, The grass withers, And the flower falls off, But the word of the Lord endures forever."



Flood: the deliverance from Egypt.
As a sleep: as to salvation and life.
Poetically like flowers and grass, in another Psalm the godly are like a tree!

Psalms 90:7-8

For we are consumed by **thine** anger, And by **thy** wrath are we troubled. **Thou** hast set our iniquities before **thee**, Our secret sins in the light of **thy** countenance.

Five pronouns in these verses.

Revelation 1:14 “His eyes were like a flame of fire.” verse 17 “fell at His feet like a dead man.” The apostle John wrote this of himself.

Psalms 90:9-10

- For all our days are passed away in **thy** wrath: We spend our years as a tale that is told. The days of our years are threescore years and ten; And if by reason of strength they be fourscore years. Yet is their strength labour and sorrow; For it is soon cut off, and we fly away.
- Ryrie: extension of life is a mixed blessing.
- Natural life, life given to us, and expectations and rewards,
- See Hebrews 1:6 “rewarder of those who seek Him.”
- Without this life we are dead in our sins.
- President Abraham Lincoln use the expression 4 score and 7 years ago.

Psalms 90:11-12

Who knoweth the power of **thine** anger? Even according to thy fear, so is **thy** wrath. So teach us to number our days, That we may apply our hearts unto wisdom.

Ryrie: Help us to allot our days wisely

“Number our days,” what does this mean in view that God has already numbered them? Job 14:5

Psalms 90:13-14

Return, O Lord, how long? And let it repent thee concerning thy servants. O satisfy us early with thy mercy; That we may rejoice and be glad all our days.

“Song of Moses” Exodus 15 praising God for His deliverance from Egypt, and his sister Miriam the prophetess, Aaron’s sister took the timbrel in her hand and all the women went out after her. Revelation 15:3 “Song of Moses.”

Psalm 90:15-16 KJV

Make us glad according to the days wherein thou hast afflicted us, And the years wherein we have seen evil. Let thy work appear unto thy servants, And thy glory unto their children.

Hebrews 12:5 “My son do not regard lightly the discipline of the LORD. Nor faint when you are reprov'd by Him.” (NASB)

Hebrews 12:11 “All discipline for the moment seems not to be joyful, but sorrowful; yet to those who have been trained by it, afterwards it yields the peaceful fruit of righteousness.”

(Reward prediction.)

“thy work unto thy children”

It occurred to me as I prepared for meeting that Moses was there with the Lord Jesus on the mountain of transfiguration, and Moses discussed the cross with the Lord Jesus. See Mark 9:4, Matthew 17:3, and Luke 9:30.

I would like to apply this statement us and our children to understand the atoning work of Christ on the cross for our salvation.

Hebrews 11:26 “considering the reproach of Christ greater than the treasures of Egypt; for he was looking for the reward.”

Hebrews 11:28 “He kept the Passover.”

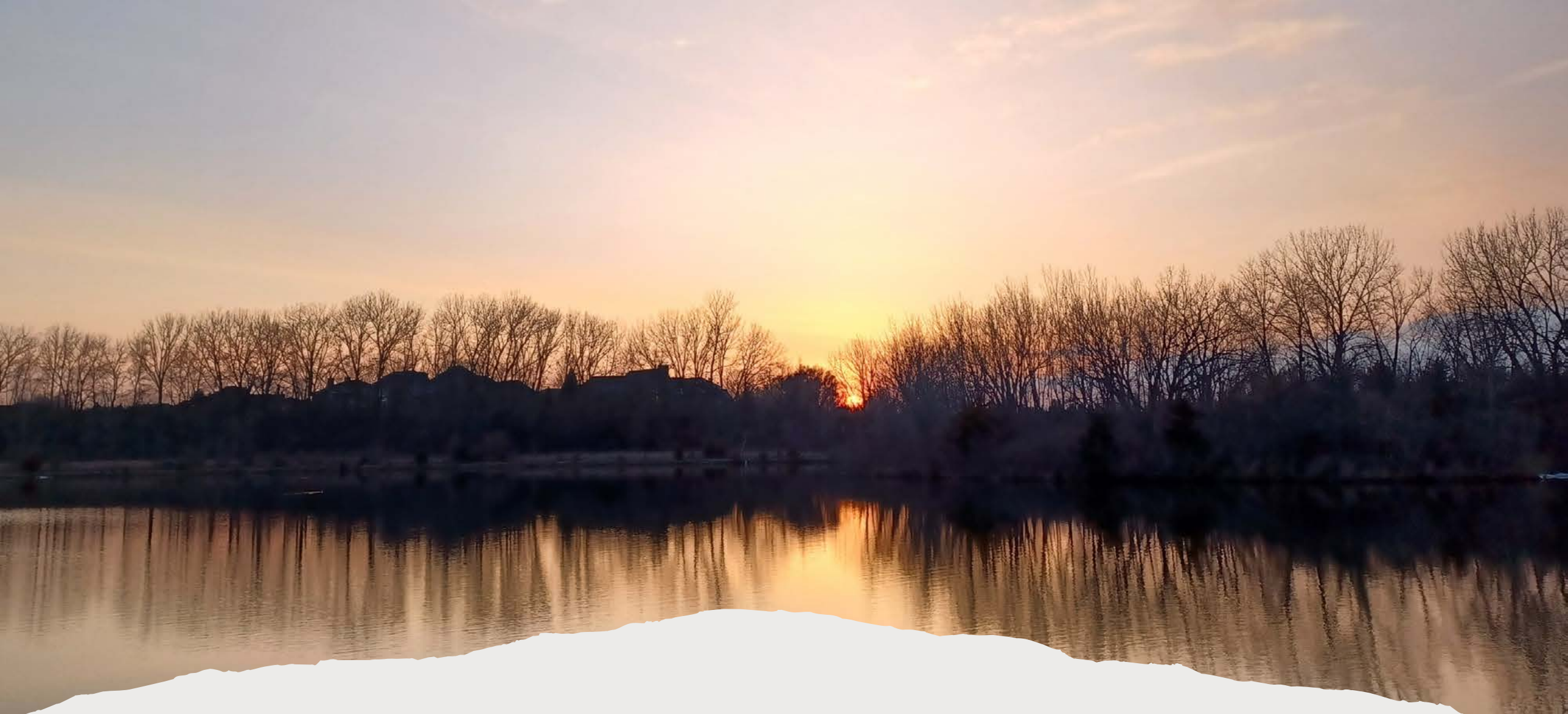
Exodus 15:22 “showed him a tree and threw it into the waters.”

Psalm 90:17

And let the beauty of the Lord our God be upon us: And establish thou the work of our hands upon us; Yea, the work of our hands establish thou it.

Ryrie: When God deals with us in lovingkindness, life will be joyous (v. 14), it will be viewed from His perspective (v. 16), and His blessing will be upon us (vv.16-17).

The capstone of our thinking is not thinking but action, using our hands.
