William D. Longstaff (1822-1894) of the United Kingdom, was born at Sutherland, Durham, England. He was the son of a wealthy ship owner. William had plenty of money to get anything he desired; yet he valued his mind enough to be mindful of holiness. On a particular Lord's Day, after having listened to the preaching of Griffith John, a China missionary on furlough to England, Longstaff wrote the words to our song. "Take Time To Be Holy."
