




Hymns For The Little Flock #104

Preface and Forward comments

Little Flock 1881 edition I believe was JND himself.

Three things are needed he wrote: Basis of truth and sound doctrine, Something of the spirit of poetry, and human affections believing what is being done together.

"thirdly the most difficult of all, the experimental acquaintance with the truth in the affections which enables a person to make this hymn (if led of God to compose one) the vehicle, in sustained thought and language, of personal grace and truth which sets the soul in communion with Christ and rises even to the Father, and yet this is such sort that it is no mere individual experience, which, for assembly worship, is out of place. In a word, the Father's love and Christ developed in the soul's affections, rising in praise back again to its source. God alone can give this so as to meet the wants of the assembly. Like assembly prayer it must not rise too completely beyond the state of the assembly, yet must reach up to God, and to raise the assembly's affections up to Him, so that what He is in grace developed in the soul should be jointly proclaimed.

"There are hymns which suit prayer meetings, home devotions, even the gospel; though there the difficulty is very great. Abstractly, you are making people sing as having certain feelings and then preaching to them because they have not. But in actual Christendom things are not so sharply defined, and there are hidden souls with hidden wants which the hymn may give expression to and set the soul free to make it apprehend God's love and sometimes more effectively than the sermon."

The reader will kindly remark that there are changes necessitated by putting "we" for "I" which, but for that, there would have been no occasion for.

Preface Hymns of Grace and Truth Copyright 1904

The hymns' selected alterations have been made, but only when necessary to correct an error, secure dignity of expression, or guard against misapprehension. In this difficult task the desire has always been to depart as little as possible from the words of the original author, whose right to his own expressions should be respected.

A word will not be out of place as to the proper use of hymns, It is surely abhorrent to a God of truth for unsaved persons to use the language of hymns suited only to believers. It is proper for the evangelist to warn the unconverted of this. Nor should the saints of God be less careful to avoid giving expression to sentiments which do not truly represent their state of soul.

So be it in the work of an evangelist. Yet on the other hand, families' devotions at the dinner table bring their children into the faith's language, and they join in too. For example, before she could talk RR was singing "Jesus Paid It All"

What about copyright? What is given to us by God must have integrity.
