

Rushed "headlong" Jude 11 Please remember what I had brought out on longing on 12.23.2023 Sunday School Opening.

In German, the feeling of longing for something that exists outside of the self to which it feels itself to be connected was crystalized in the word 'das Sehnen' They complain of boredom (rather than the kingdom) they seek the excitement of new things, but nothing satisfies the ache. They recreate a life that is made only of little things, not the whole.

Here are some Biblical longings that had gone right and gone wrong.

King David, Laban to Jacob, Shechem, and King David. Psalm 84:2, Genesis 31:30, Genesis 34:8, 2 Samuel 13:39. New Testament Longings by the Apostle Paul: Romans 1:11, Romans 8:19, 2 Corinthians 5:2, Philippians 2:26, Philippians 4:1,1 Timothy 6:10, 2 Timothy 1:4.

- McGilchrist continued with 'longing' explaining that this 'das Sehnen' is the same root word as a tendon. The object of longing is that towards which we 'tend' and tendon is similarly related to the words 'tend' and 'tendency.' In fact, the English word 'sinew' is cognate with 'die Sehne' and 'sinew' use to refer to the whole elastic union of muscle and tendon. These images suggest the working of a joint, as for example, the elbow. The joint is made possible by the existence of the tendon, an elastic connection that allows the bones to take part in the joint (but do not constitute the joint) to move away from each other and to remain connected. Or to move together and remain separate.
- I don't think I will ever hear the word tendency the same way as before. I had thought only the actual tendon, not the German meaning.
